Federal Reserve Chair Kevin Warsh said more work may be needed if inflation does not move clearly towards 2%. Rate-hike expectations rose.

The deep dive

The dollar and short-term yields strengthened. Later market observations showed broad equity funds lower, long bonds down, gold and silver sharply lower, and Bitcoin weaker. Microsoft stayed positive, so this was not a full market exit.
